Welcome from Mr Lewis-Cole

Hello! Welcome back after the Christmas break. Are we still able to say Happy New Year? Well, just in case I haven't had the chance to so far, Happy New Year to all of our families and the Lipson Vale community. This term seems to be whizzing by already and school has been bustling with new learning and events. I feel we are set for an exciting term.

Peer Mediator training

We were very excited to welcome Leanne from Behaviour Matters into school this week to begin our peer mediator training. Leanne is training 24 pupils over the next 2 weeks on all the skills needed to be excellent peer mediators. After week one, the feedback is incredibly positive and the 24 pupils are taking their new roles very seriously. Once trained, we are looking forward to our 24 peer mediator graduates taking up their new roles and providing ongoing support to other pupils across the school when they face challenges at break and lunch times. We are very much looking forward to week 2 of the training.

Community Defibrillator

With support from the Department of Education, we have been able to secure a defibrillator for the school. As we firmly believe that we are here for our community, we have decided to install this just outside the school gates meaning that, in a moment of need, anyone within the Lipson Vale community can access this life saving device. The next nearest defibrillator is over 10 minutes away so we recognise that such a device is desperately needed. Whilst the casing for our defibrillator is currently in place, it will be a week or so before it becomes useable.

You will hopefully already be aware that we are holding this terms parents' evenings on Tuesday 6th and Thursday 8th February (with the exception of Otters class, which are happening a week earlier). The booking system will go live shortly for you to book your slots. Parents' evenings are always an important part of the school calendar and a real opportunity for you to hear about how your child is getting on in school and what we are supporting them to improve further. SEND and Inclusion Lead

As you will know, Mrs Timony retired at Christmas. Our new SEND and Inclusion Lead has now started with us and I am pleased to introduce you all to Miss Naylor. She has been incredibly busy so far getting to know our pupils, the team and many of the families. I know that Miss Naylor is currently organising time to meet with families who have a child with special educational needs and will be extending this invitation to parents/carers who may want to introduce themselves. Miss Naylor is an experienced SENDCo who has previously worked across multiple schools in Devon and I know that she will be of great support to our pupils and the community.

Hi everyone,



All of the adults were very impressed with their questioning skills and the application of their historical knowledge.








Feedback from The Box:

In Year 4, the Dolphins and Otters classes have enjoyed undertaking a design and technology project this week, designing and creating shell structures for desk tidies. During the week, the children have investigated the properties of 3D shapes, created nets using computer aided design (CAD) and considered the features the net would require to be assembled into a sturdy structure, including the positioning of the faces and tabs. We have had great fun learning to score and laminate material, assembling and decorating our structures.









The Foundation children love the opportunity to get outside and Monday of this week was no exception. We wrapped up warm and had lots of fun with the outside toys, also practicing our maths skills with lots of counting and 'one more than' learning opportunities. We have very large toy dinosaurs outside and today some of the children created their own Museum for them to live in. They spent a long time carefully building the enclosure and then even longer placing them into their new home.







