Year 4 have been extending their understanding of rhythm in using more complicated rhythmic phrases and using these in an accompaniment.




Today in our music assembly,

We are excited to share that our Year 3 science class has started a new history module exploring the Stone Age! The students have been learning about prehistory and studying timelines to understand how people lived during this time. They even got to be archaeologists for a day and carefully uncovered some artifacts from the Stone Age. Using their critical thinking skills, they tried to figure out what the artifacts were and who might have used them.











This week, the Dolphins and Otters classes immersed themselves in the wordless picture book, Flotsam, by making predictions, summarising the story and learning the text to inspire our own writing. The children created some fantastic storyboards to help them retell the narrative.




### **Accelerated Readers**
