End of Year Six Celebration Afternoon and BBQ

On **Monday 24th July**, we will be holding the annual Year Six **celebration** and **BBQ** on the field. During the afternoon, the children will be provided with a BBQ (burger, sausage, crisps and drinks) by the PTFA. Sadly, this year we cannot have our traditional water fight due to the hosepipe ban.
