This week, Year 5 have been immersing themselves in our science unit which is focused on living things and their habitats. In class, we have been exploring the life cycles of insects, amphibians and birds. The children have been researching different birds to understand how their life cycles are similar or different to others.

Recently, as part of their project 'Evolution and Adaptation', Year Six were visited by Adrian Chapman in the role of Charles Darwin. They had a jam-packed day of learning all about his famous exploration trip on HMS Beagle where he discovered many new species. They also took part in a 'Survival of the Fittest' experiment, comparing the numbers of white and black moths that could be collected depending on the background colour of the 'habitat'. Other fun activities included a dinosaur hunt, fossil dig and a game called 'Guess the Mystery Object'. A great day!







This term, the children have been learning all about *People Who Help Us*, exploring the important roles different members of our community play. In literacy, we've been diving into the book *Unfortunately*, using it as inspiration to write our own exciting stories filled with problems and solutions. The children have done a fantastic job using adjectives to bring their writing to life!

In maths, we've been focusing on place value within 100. The children have shown great progress, especially with counting confidently from 50 to 100. It's been wonderful to see their enthusiasm and growing confidence across all areas of learning.

We've also been learning about plants—what they need to grow and how we care for them. As part of our science work, we planted cress seeds and watched them grow. The highlight was getting to taste the cress we grew ourselves!



More details will be sent home soon!


