Meet the teacher

You will have, earlier this week, received information about your child's year groups' 'meet the teacher' informal meeting date and time. These are a great way to speak to the adults who will be working with your child over the next year and find out key information, as well as about the curriculum ahead. I hope that you are able to attend these meetings. As I said, these are information sessions and there will be some key information to collect and the opportunity for you to talk through aspects of the new year group with key members of staff.

Attendance and punctuality

A gentle reminder that pupils are expected to attend school every day and arrive on time. The bell will continue to ring at 8.55am and any pupils who arrive after this time are late and should sign in via the office. School starts at 8.45am and I encourage everyone to aim to be in the classroom by this time. We are now opening the main school gate at 8.30am which should help in everyone being ready to come into school on time. Poor attendance at the start of a new school year is recognised as a key sign that attendance throughout the year will be poor. The attendance leadership team in school will be making contact with families shortly who are already showing concerning attendance. The start of a new school year is a great time to get into positive attendance and punctuality habits - aim for 8.45am.

They took on the role of rock detectives, and here's a sneak peek into their adventures: **Classification Challenge:** Our curious minds sorted through a wide range of different rocks, deciphering their unique characteristics and properties. It was incredible to see their critical thinking skills in action!

Formation Insights: The highlight of the day was learning about the three primary types of natural rocks: igneous, sedimentary, and metamorphic. The students explored how these rocks are formed, igniting their curiosity about the Earth's geological history.




