PE Days:

Our PE sessions are on a Tuesday and a Thursday (weather dependent). Please ensure that your child comes to school in their PE kit on these days. As the weather gets colder, we encourage the children to wear tracksuits for outside sessions.

Homework Expectations:

- **Reading:** Reading underpins all other areas of the curriculum and is pivotal to your child's learning. As a school, we expect children to read to an adult at least three times a week at home. This reading is recorded on the BoomReader app.
 - Children on Read Write Inc: Your child will bring home a familiar RWI book on a Friday, which matches their current phonic knowledge. Your child should practise reading the story multiple times throughout the week. Please discuss the text with them using the questions inside the book. It is beneficial for them to also enjoy a range of other books at home.
 - Children on AR: Your child will bring home the book they are reading in class to continue with at home. Once they have finished reading their book, they will complete a quiz in school to show how much they have understood.

All children will also have the opportunity to take home a library book each week to enjoy at home.

- **Spellings:** We will be sending home a copy of the common exception words that children need to be able to spell by the end of KS1. Please practise learning to spell a few of these each week with your child. We will be testing whether they can accurately spell a selection of these words each term.
- **Home learning grid:** Each half term, we will give your child a home learning grid with creative activity suggestions linked to our topics and maths learning. These are not compulsory but are encouraged. Each piece brought into school will be celebrated in class.

Statutory Tests:

• Phonics Screening Check: Some children will need to retake their Phonics Screening Check to try to reach the expected standard. This is for children who did not reach the pass mark in Year 1. Children will be asked to practise reading a range of real and nonsense words. This allows us to see how your child is progressing with their reading and find out how we can best help them further.

How to help your child at home:

- Encourage your child to ensure they have everything they need for the day, such as their water bottle, coat and reading books.
- Ensure all your child's belongings are named.
- Teach your child to dress independently.
- Support them regularly with their phonics, reading, maths and spellings.
- Talk about their day with them and help promote a love for learning!




Google Classroom:
