## Welcome from Mr Lewis-Cole

#### **Mental Health First Aiders**

We have been very fortunate to have had the opportunity to train around 10 members of staff as mental health first aiders for children and a further 10 for adults. We have been thinking a lot about mental health and wellbeing over the last year and Mrs Stephens has been working incredibly hard behind the scenes to create a school wide approach to support everyone with their mental health and wellbeing. This training, which Mrs Stephens was able to secure through funding by a charity, was delivered by Mental Health First Aider England over 2 days. The very detailed training has prepared adults from across the school to further understand the signs and symptoms of poor mental health and were trained on specific strategies to use with children and adults. Thank you to Mrs Stephens for bringing this excellent training and support into our school community.



- Make a list of jobs that you think robots would be good at and a list of those that you think people will always be needed for.




During Switch off Fortnight, the children across the school have enjoyed learning about fashion and what our clothes are made of and where they come from.

buy clothes made of sustainable fabrics.



## love to learn

Year 4 had great fun on their trip to the Energy from Waste plant in Plymouth learning some incredible facts about what happens to our waste and how to reduce our waste by reducing, reusing and recycling (the 3 R's). We learned that an amazing 245,000 tonnes of waste is delivered to the plant every year and that the waste burns in the combustion chamber at temperatures higher than 1,000 hotter than lava!

















This week Year 1 have been listening to the story, The Disgusting Sandwich. They have been discussing and writing about their likes and dislikes about the story. Also, the children have been learning what a verb is - ask them. They will tell you. To learn about verbs, the

Starfish and Mussels have had a special visitor this week come in to teach us about why Christmas is important to Christians. We all discussed what signs of Christmas we have seen and how we prepare for the day. We then listened to the Christmas story and used Christmas cards to help us learn the story and see the significance of the pictures used at Christmas time.













In Year 5, we continued with our content designing unit in computing. This week, we were given the task to draw our own penguin using Google Draw. We had to think about how to create the correct shapes and select the appropriate colours for our pictures. It took a lot of concentration but the end results were great!

Last week, Year 6 took part in a workshop run by the NSPCC who passed on the very important message of 'Speak Out and Stay Safe'. We addressed the importance of voicing our worries and sharing our concerns with safe adults and people that we trust. 
#### **Accelerated Readers**




