

Year 6 Termly Project



The Autumn term project is a research-based homework task. It will enable you to gather information about a topic that interests you and present your findings in the style of a secondary school assignment.

In recent years, children have chosen areas of study such as:

- Famous people - either current day superstars or historical figures such as Isaac Newton or King Henry VIII.
- Animals - dolphins, tigers, working dogs & dinosaurs have all proved popular in the past.
- Sport has also been researched with projects such as the history of the Olympics or even the formation of Plymouth Argyle.

You can, of course, choose something which interests or inspires you such as music, dance, skateboarding or gymnastics. You could also choose something linked to the topic work in school, for example, a study of Hindu Gods.

Whatever the choice of topic, the project should be either assembled into a folder OR presented on Google Classroom.

The following items should be included:

- Eye catching front cover/slide.
- Introduction - explaining why the topic was chosen.
- A contents page/slide (numbered or bullet pointed).
- Subheadings to clearly identify each section.
- A conclusion which indicates what you have learnt by completing the project.

A few reminders for the task:

- ✓ Avoid copying chunks of information from the internet.
- ✓ Use pictures and diagrams to make the work interesting.
- ✓ Use careful handwriting or, if you are using ICT, make it look professional by paying attention to the layout and use of fonts.
- ✓ Do a little bit at a time and spread the work over the whole of the term.
- ✓ Finally, remember to choose something that you know there is plenty of information on and it must also be something you find really interesting.
- ✓ The project is due in by FRIDAY 8th DECEMBER.
