- Topic based tasks which you can choose from, complete, and bring in to school to share with the class. Some pieces will be displayed.

Ancient Greek, Sustainable Development and Science based voluntary home learning tasks:		
Find out what foods are popular in modern Greece. Make an information booklet including facts, recipes and pictures.	Create a Google Slide presentation about properties of different materials you can find out on a walk.	Plan and produce your very own Sustainable Development Goal to present to your class.
Make a timeline of key events from the Ancient Greek period. Think carefully about ordering numbers and positioning them on a number line.	Create a passionate speech about sustainability that could be presented to the world. Think carefully about what would inspire and motivate you.	Choreograph a dance for the opening ceremony of the Olympics. Write out a set of instructions so you can teach the class. You might want to take pictures of yourself (and / or friends and family) doing the dance.
Create a diagram of a sustainable city with your own labels and your unique city name.	Design and make your own Greek building. What is it used for?	Try out some Ancient Greek Olympic events and take photos.
Write your own version of a Greek Myth. Add illustrations.	Design and make a Greek toga.	What was invented in Ancient Greek times? Make a factsheet.
