This document details all home learning for the Autumn Term 1 (this is also available on the school website). Some home learning activities are compulsory and others voluntary.

### **Compulsory:**

- Complete the Maths task set on Times Table Rockstars.

### **Voluntary:**

- Topic based tasks which you are encouraged to choose from, complete and bring in to school to share and celebrate with the class. Some pieces will be displayed.

### **Ancient Egypt voluntary home learning tasks:**

Make a mask or headdress for one of the Egyptian Gods or princesses.	Design an advertising poster for cruises down the River Nile. What will tourists see as they cruise?	Research the Ancient Egyptian hieroglyphic alphabet and use it to create a short poem or story
Make an Egyptian artefact. Some ideas might be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A scarab beetle amulet</li> <li>• A painting in the Egyptian style</li> <li>• A model of an Egyptian god</li> <li>• A pyramid</li> </ul>	Research an aspect of Ancient Egyptian life that really interests you. You might decide to present your information in a booklet, in a PowerPoint presentation, on a poster or as a talk accompanied with pictures/photos.	Design an Ancient Egyptian themed restaurant. What is it called? How does it look? What do the waiting staff wear? What food and drink does it serve?
Make your own version of the Rosetta Stone. Paint some of the hieroglyphs that you know on to it.	Imagine that you are a British journalist sent over to Luxor to interview Howard Carter. Write down the questions you would ask him.	Cook some food inspired by Ancient Egypt and bring in a photo showing how you made it.
Create Top Trump cards for Ancient Egyptian gods and goddesses.	Design some jewellery inspired by one of the Egyptian gods.	Create a quiz about Ancient Egypt – this could be on paper, PowerPoint or Kahoot.
